## *View from the Dome*

I apologize for the lateness of this "summer" issue when Fall has definitely fell! But it has been a wild summer at KRT!

Interest in our radionic instruments continues to grow around the nation and the world. This summer I taught the "Fundamentals of Radionics" course twice at the dome and again in Bismark, North Dakota, helping clients from all walks of life to become competent and confident in the use of their radionic instruments. During this time **we've shipped Replicators, Personal Instruments, Beacons and Workstations across the nation and around the world** thanks in no small part to interest generated by the free online manual we released this spring *Radionics Book 2: Applied Radionics*. Fully 45% of the visitors that come to the KRT website are from countries outside of the United States, with instruments dispatched to clients as far away as Poland, Indonesia and Mozambique.

Also this summer, Cathie and I attended the 36<sup>th</sup> annual conference of the United States Psychotronics Association, a not-for-profit organization dedicated to research, innovation and sharing in the esoteric sciences. Our founder, Peter J. Kelly, was a founding member of the organization in 1974, so **I was very proud to be elected to the Board of Directors** at this meeting. In this role I am advocating for freedom of information at every level, with an emphasis on building a forum in which folks can share ideas, challenges and solutions discovered in all their esoteric research. I also hope to drive this organization to better serve the needs of the countless radionics users out there, filling a void that currently exists in the United States. With past leadership by such greats as Dr. T Galen Hieronymus, Charles Whitehouse, and Peter J. Kelly the USPA has only to claim this throne. With our support this great organization will step up to bat and become a central meeting place for the radionic arts in North America through both an online presence and continuation of the annual meetings that allow people to meet face-to-face for lectures, workshops and friendship.

But wait, there's more! This summer we've also developed a new product! After countless requests from the radionics community, at long last KRT will produce an accessory tuning system that will allow users to instantly add new rate banks to existing radionic instruments. **The KRT Tuning Station adds four rate banks to any instrument:** three classic half-dial (180 degree) banks and a single round-dial (360 degree) bank. Our prototype testers in the field have revealed several applications for these versatile instruments, which are explored in a story beginning on page 5. Christmas is coming early this year, as we are also offering a special incentive to pre-order this new instrument before it is added to the website or the catalog. And things are not slowing down in the months ahead, either! On November 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> I'll be participating in **a special reunion workshop in Des Moines, Iowa, for all the students of Pat Schmidt**. This meeting has been organized by two of Pat's students - Marty Lucas and Kent Friedrichson of Every Advantage Consulting – with the blessing of Pat's brother Bill. The workshop will include intermediate-level radionic concepts and an opportunity to meet in a social setting with old friends.

Immediately preceding the reunion workshop, **on November 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> I will also lead a Fundamentals of Radionics course at the same location** for those new students that want to give radionics a try, as well as those "old hands" who would like a chance to brush up on the basics in a classroom environment. In that class we will focus on how to conduct basic analysis and balancing broadcasts, how to use worksheets, and building confidence with the radionic instrument.

These should be interesting workshops! Marty and Kent are commercial farmers who have tons of hands-on experience. Their work has been published in this newsletter previously, and **you can read Marty's essay "Unusual Reagents" on page 10 of this newsletter**.
